#### **Softer Stances on Doctrine**

Recently, I was contacted by a retiring minister. He said he had become an elder with the congregation and was given the job of seeking his replacement. We spoke for nearly an hour and things seemed fine until he asked me about certain doctrines. He was specific about a few and I quoted the scripture pertaining to them. He then told me he had preached for over 50 years and in the last 20 or so he had "softened his stance" on these key doctrines we discussed. He admitted he had no scripture for his position, he just "felt" differently now. I told him that I wouldn't be a good fit and we parted ways.

Brethren, he unknowingly summed up one of the largest problems in the church. He and others would like to move God's boundaries because of their unpopularity. Proverbs 14:12, "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death." Solomon summed up God's position on "softening" His doctrine. Jesus said in Matt. 7:21 that not everyone who called Him, Lord, would go to heaven but those who do His will. How can any serious-minded person not understand the severity of ignoring God's commands or "softening" them? "Softer stances" are going to bring warmer climates on judgment day, if you know what I mean.

Of course, we all sin! Romans 3:23 reminds us that we all fall short of the glory of God. But, there is a difference in occasionally stumbling and intentionally being disobedient or willfully ignoring what God has said.

"Therefore whoever hears these sayings of mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock, And the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock. But everyone who hears these sayings of mine, and does not do them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand" (Matthew 7:24-26). Jesus was preaching in this passage about standing on the "soft" ground or soft stances. It won't hold up!

I pray that we would all seek to build on the "rock" or true foundation. We can't change it, only live by it. In the end, the climate will be better too!

## **Peddling False Hope**

Dr. William Bennett hosts "Morning in America," a radio program aired every weekday on Louisville AM station WGTK. One morning he quoted someone who had said that Democrats could sell freezers to Eskimos easier than Republicans could sell them blankets. Acknowledging this to be so, Bennett explained that "this is because Republicans tell the truth."

Although I couldn't agree that politicians of either major party consistently speak the truth, the freezer/blankets analogy intrigues me—especially when applied to spiritual things. Have you ever noticed that wolves dressed in sheepskin can peddle false hope easier than Gospel preachers can persuade the lost to embrace true life? A charming and eloquent preacher, full of lies and smiles, comes to town, and boom! In no time at all, "his church" (that's how he himself thinks of it) grows to a membership of hundreds or thousands. But when an equally gifted man comes along preaching only Christ and him crucified, the congregation he works with experiences comparatively modest numerical growth.

Why is it easier to sell Eskimos freezers than blankets? The apostle Paul warned Timothy that "the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own likings, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander into myths" (2 Tim. 4:3-4). In other words, most people vastly prefer to hear what is appealing, even if it is false. This explains the success of financial scams. Suppose that you get a check in the mail for \$5,000. To claim it, all you have to do is wire \$2,000 to someone in Nigeria. Which is more appealing—the prospect of winning \$3,000 or the possibility of being cheated? And which is more appealing—the false doctrine that no one can ever fall from grace or the biblical truth that Christians must be faithful until death (Rev. 2:10)?
